

Ali and Nino Kurban Said	Love story between a Muslim boy and a Christian girl written by a Jew set in Azerbaijan in the early 20th century.
The Widows of Malabar Hill Sujuta Massey	A murder mystery set in 1920s India
The Far Field Madhuri Vijay	An Indian woman seeking to know more about her mother's death, travels to Kashmir and becomes embroiled in the religious and political turmoil there.
