2. Dialectical Materialism

states that history is moved along through class conflict leading ultimately to a perfectly equal (Communist) Society

Why is Dialectical Materialism a teleological view of history?

3. Francis Fukuyama's End of History View

- after the fall of communism in 1990 Fukuyama argues that the progress of mankind had ended.
- he argued that there was no greater form of government than liberal democracy.
 - liberal democracy: government elected by free and fair elections with universal suffrage; usually with a free market (capitalist) economy










Arguments for Fukuyama




V. Jared Diamond's View author of <u>Guns Germs and Steel</u> history is determined by geography
